

Spectator Guide

In most cases, spectators are welcome to attend NJSGA Championships. At the NJSGA Open and Amateur Championships, spectators are strongly encouraged to visit the registration table where a course map, groupings, and a championship guide are available. If you are planning to visit a NJSGA Championship, please be sure to carefully read the following prior to your arrival.

Dress Code:

The dress code for each event is available as part of the player information sheet. This dress code applies to players, caddies, and spectators. Spectators who are not dressed appropriately may be denied entry to the facility, or may be asked to leave until appropriately dressed. In general, shirts must have a collar and must be tucked in; hats must be worn forward, and t-shirts, cargo shorts/pants, denim, and non-soft soled shoes are prohibited. Women must wear shorts/pants of appropriate length; halter-tops or strap-less tops are not permitted. This dress code is not all-inclusive and varies from one venue to another.

Cell Phones, Cameras, other Electronics:

Cell phones, PDA's, radios, iPads, iPods and the like are NOT permitted on the golf course, or inside or near the clubhouse. A guest should set his/her phone to vibrate, and only use their phone/PDA in the parking lot. The use of cameras for personal use is permitted, however good judgment should be exercised especially in the area of play.

Golf Course Courtesy:

Spectators should remain quiet and clear of play at all times. They should be aware of groups behind and on adjacent holes, and alert for errant golf balls. Spectators should not be on or near teeing grounds, putting greens, and bunkers. Spectators are strongly discouraged from walking on fairways, or near enough a player which might give the appearance that the player and spectator are exchanging information or advice, which may be a breach of the Rules.

Other notes:

- Golf Carts for spectators are NOT permitted. No exceptions will be made.
- Spectators should note that neither the NJSGA, nor the host club, are responsible for any injury, illness, loss, damage or destruction of property resulting directly or indirectly from visiting a NJSGA event. Spectators assume all risk associated with their attendance.
- Children under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian at all times.
- The NJSGA and host club work cooperatively to conduct an event. Therefore, the NJSGA supports all club policies and directives as they apply to guests.
- Exemplary conduct is expected at all times. Please remember that you are a guest and should demonstrate appropriate behavior while on club property.
